Secondly, in non consumer contracts, the buyer is prevented from rejecting the goods and terminating the contract, in the wake of a breach of one or more of the implied conditions in sections 13-15 of the Sale of Goods Act, where the injurious consequences of the breach are so slight that it would be unreasonable to reject the goods.

What Is a Consumer Contract? A consumer contract is a contract made between a merchant seller and a consumer. According to the Uniform Commercial Code which governs contracts, a “merchant” is any person who deals in goods of the kind of their occupation, or has knowledge or skill related to the goods involved in the transaction.

The Consumer Contracts (Information, Cancellation and Additional Charges) Regulations 2013 require traders to give you certain information. The Regulations came into force on 13 June 2014 and apply to contracts entered into on or after that date. If you entered into a contract prior to 13 June 2014, these Regulations will not apply.

In Australia, the rules of contract law are mainly derived from judges' decisions in court cases—known as 'common law' or 'case law'—as well as legislation.
