Reflective practice is undertaken not just to revisit the past but to guide future action. Reflective practitioners use all 4 of the essential modes of reflection: Reflection-in-action is taking note of thinking and actions as they are occurring and making immediate adjustments as events unfold.

### Reflective practice - Department of Education

Schon's theory of reflective practice was developed in his seminal book 'The Reflective Practitioner: How Professionals Think in Action', first published in 1983 and then republished in 1991. Unlike Kolb's (1984) reflective theory , Schon's theory is not a multi-stage or circular model of reflection.

Co-operative Inquiry is a reflective practice method for groups which was initially developed by John Heron to support the reflective practice of participatory researchers. Heron, a pioneer in the development of participatory methods in the social sciences, describes the theory and practice of the method in his 1996 book, Co-operative Inquiry: research into the human condition .

Reflective practice happens when you explore an experience you have had to identify what happened, and what your role in this experience was - including your behaviour and thinking, and related emotions.
